29	30	The original concert featuring Paul Robeson and others was to be held on Aug. 27, 1949, to benefit the Harlem chapter of the Civil Rights Congress. Before Robeson arrived, white mobs attacked attendees, burned a cross and lynched an effigy as police looked on. A bigger concert was rescheduled for Sept. 4, and 20,000 attended. That time, communists and unionists provided security, keeping both the KKK and the police out. However, many attendees were attacked by racist mobs on their way home. Then as now, safety from fascist violence is up to us.
